Happy Easter!

I have a thing about chalk streams. Their eddies, shallow clarity, crisp cool waters and living habitats have been a spiritual place of home all my life. How do you relate to them? Can you afford not to take time and daydream into them?

For me, it's the quieter stretches of chalk stream that I love. Behind the bank and hedge where they turn out of sight. They keep flowing, they keep nourishing, they keep me. And within them is myriad life. Plants I should try to learn [but won't] and crawling, sliding and darting living things of all scales beyond any counting – these things are beloved. From that abundance of life under one tiny, shinny, gravel stone, to the abundance of life in that tiny blue dot the Earth is when viewed from space – God adores it and holds it.

Jesus offers us living water – I think that is like these gentle, clear streams that spring up in our Benefice and water and grace our villages here. Their gentle sound has resonated in these valleys for so long. And God has wandered along their banks for so long.

When I started as your Rector, your priest; the most important part of my installation service for me was the Cure of Souls. It is an agreement between me and the Bishop to care for all the souls that are in the Benefice. All. In aeroplanes above, in the animals of the hedgerow, in us. God's love is for everything.

For in Christ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Christ, God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of the cross. [Col 1: 19-20]

So, for me, there is a sacredness to all life in the benefice where I have the care of souls.

I'm here to serve that. Not to ask for creeds or belief. But simply to walk alongside, knowing Christ walks with us.

And the gentle music of these chalk streams has been accompanied by another gentle music of these valleys. This is the music and ministry of John Radford. For over thirty years his music is the prayers of the Benefice, the treasure of our hopes and praise, the care of our feelings and faith. His music is a continual prayer for countless thousands of souls who have prayed on their own, or been married here or baptised or committed to the love of God at the end of their lives. His service to the living presence of God among us is a jewel in our midst. Bless you John!

And bless you in your Easter. All things are beloved to God so, please let me know if you'd like a blessing on your home, family, beloved pets, motorcycles – I am here for you and your journeys.


